Chapter 1: Introduction – Why Power Matters

"Tarry in Jerusalem until you are endued with power from on high." – Luke 24:49

Power is not an optional luxury for the believer. It is not a ministry-specific tool reserved for apostles and prophets. Power is the *lifeline* of the Christian faith—the very substance that transforms doctrine into reality, confessions into manifestations, and salvation into dominion. Without power, Christianity becomes nothing more than a philosophy—intellectually sound, but spiritually bankrupt.

Jesus, the Son of God, spent thirty years in obscurity. He was God in the flesh, walking among men, yet His presence alone did not shatter the darkness. The Void in Modern Christianity

Paul didn't say, "I am not ashamed of the gospel because it is wise." He said, "It is the power of God unto salvation" (Romans 1:16). In other words, the Gospel is only as potent as the level of power that backs it.

Why the Devil Fears Power

Satan is not intimidated by your Bible knowledge. He is not moved by your church attendance. What shakes the kingdom of darkness is power, because power enforces authority. It is the only language spirits understand.

The devil is described as a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour (1 Peter 5:8). His agenda is clear: to steal, to kill, and to destroy (John 10:10). But Jesus said, "I have come that you may have life, and have it to the full." That fullness is only possible when power is present. Without power, your life remains vulnerable. Without power, your spiritual inheritance becomes inaccessible.

Principles Without Power Will Fail

Principles are good. Wisdom is necessary. But when the enemy rises like a flood, it is not principles that lift the standard — it is the Spirit, and the Spirit comes with power (Isaiah 59:19). Jesus did not send His disciples out to preach immediately. Even after spending years with them, teaching and training them, He said, "Wait. Tarry. Don't move. Don't start anything until power comes." (Luke 24:49) This command is proof that without power, ministry is ineffective. Without power, destiny is delayed. Without power, the believer becomes an endangered species.

Chapter 2: The Danger of Religion Without Power

"Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away." – 2 Timothy 3:5

Religion without power is one of Satan's most successful strategies. It deceives believers into thinking they are safe while keeping them bound. It offers rituals without results, traditions without transformation, and words without weight. It builds cathedrals of form, while the fire of reality is absent.

The Bible doesn't only warn against sin; it warns against powerless Christianity (I Corinthians 4:20). A faith that has no encounter. A walk with God that is void of manifestation. A belief system that is built entirely on theory, absent of any evidence.

Belief Without Encounter Is Dangerous

The easiest way to manipulate a man is to keep him at the level of belief without experience. That's why most religions stop at "believing." But in Christ, belief is just the door — not the destination. True faith progresses to **encounters**, **revelations**, and **powerful manifestations**.

Apostle John didn't say, "That which we have believed." He said:

"That which we have heard, that which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon, and our hands have handled, of the Word of life..." (1 John 1:1)

That's not belief. That's **experience**. That's **encounter**. That's **power**.

Religion teaches us to believe and wait passively for change. The Kingdom calls us to believe, contend, and manifest the reality of Christ here and now.

The Tragedy of Powerless Christianity

Manipulated Minds and Powerless Churches

Satan doesn't mind you going to church, as long as nothing changes. He doesn't fear the pulpit—unless fire flows from it. He doesn't mind your beliefs, as long as they never translate into power.

That's why he's happy to keep people in cycles of routine—prayer without impact, fasting without transformation, declarations without manifestation. He knows the moment power is introduced, his reign ends.

Paul warned Timothy that in the last days, many would have a form of godliness but would deny the power thereof. That is not atheism — that is Christianity without power. It is liturgy without life. It is theology without fire.

Power Transforms Everything

When power enters your life:

- Prayer becomes authority.
- Worship becomes warfare.
- M Holiness becomes a weapon.
- Revelation becomes reality.

Without power, you may be saying all the right things, but getting none of the right results. That's the danger of religion: it keeps you in church but outside of victory.

Jesus didn't die just to make us churchgoers. He died and rose so we could carry **His Spirit**—and by that Spirit, carry **His power**.

Reflection & Activation

Ask yourself honestly:

- M Has your faith produced visible power?
- Are you experiencing the reality of God, or just rehearsing the stories?
- Are demons afraid of your name the way they feared Paul?

If not, don't settle. This book will show you how to step into power—practically and biblically.

Chapter 3: The Foundation of Victory—Forgiveness, Righteousness, Sanctification & Consecration

Before power can flow through a man, there must be a foundation deep enough to sustain it. A life of power is not built on charisma or bold declarations. It is built on a solid spiritual structure—a deep walk with God, where truths are not just known but *embodied*.

Four pillars lay the groundwork for any believer who wants to walk in power and victory:

- Forgiveness
- Righteousness
- Sanctification
- Consecration

Each of these doctrines is a spiritual operation, a divine process designed to shape your nature, your perspective, and your relationship with God. Let's explore each one.

1. Forgiveness: Access to God's Heart

Without forgiveness, no relationship with God is possible. It is the entry point of salvation. But it is more than that—it's a revelation of *unconditional love*. When you understand God's forgiveness, your motivation for seeking Him changes.

You're no longer trying to earn God's approval through performance. You realize you are already *accepted*, not because you're perfect, but because Jesus is. That is the freedom of forgiveness.

But if you don't understand this, your entire Christian life will be based on guilt and striving, and power doesn't flow in guilt. It flows in **freedom**.

2. Righteousness: Access to God's Realm

If forgiveness grants you a *relationship with God*, righteousness gives you *rights*. Many believers have been forgiven but still live like beggars in the spirit. Why? Because they don't know righteousness is more than mercy—it is identity.

Righteousness means you are not just allowed into God's realm by kindness; you are **legally** part of it. You have standing. You belong. You don't just worship at God's feet—you rule from His throne. You have the right to function where God functions.

That's why the Bible says, "The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much" (James 5:16).
Righteousness is a status that heaven recognizes—and hell

fears.

3. Sanctification: Living for God Alone

You can be forgiven. You can be righteous. But you can still live for yourself. Sanctification takes it a step further. It is the operation of the Spirit that **separates you for God's exclusive use**.

The Greek word is **hagiazo** — to purify, to set apart. Sanctification is not just about avoiding sin. It is about *belonging wholly to God*.

The Holy Spirit was given not just to bless you but to **possess you**. He begins to reprogram your mind, renew your soul, and anchor your desires to the heart of God. You no longer ask, "What can I get from God?" but "How can I serve His will?"

This is the making of a vessel. And only sanctified vessels can carry fire.

4. Consecration: Partnership with the Spirit

Forgiveness is a gift. Righteousness is a status. Sanctification is a work of the Spirit. But **consecration** is your response.

Consecration is when you *choose* to yield. It is when you partner with God's dealings in your life. You begin to align your daily choices, your disciplines, your time, and your appetites with heaven's agenda.

Consecration says, "I am not my own." It takes what is legally yours in the spirit and makes it your daily reality. Consecration is when the Spirit has not only your spirit, but your body, your soul, your career, your relationships—your entire life.

Only consecrated men can be entrusted with unusual dimensions of power. Because power in the hands of a fleshly man becomes destruction. But power in the hands of a consecrated man becomes revival.

The Balance Is Everything

Some understand forgiveness, but reject consecration—and they become careless, lawless, and lascivious.

Some understand consecration, but forget forgiveness—and they become legalistic, proud, and performance-driven.

The balance of these four doctrines is what builds a man who walks in **purity, authority, and power**. When the inward foundation is in place, power will no longer destroy you. It will lift you. It will flow through you.

Summary

- Forgiveness brings you into God's love.
- Righteousness gives you access to His throne.
- Sanctification separates you from the world.
- **Consecration** partners you with the Spirit's purpose.

Together, they form the unshakable foundation of a powerful

life.

Chapter 4: The Doctrine of Power

"You shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost has come upon you..." – Acts 1:8

Power is not a mystery reserved for a spiritual elite. It is a doctrine—a systematic teaching of God, revealed through Scripture, experienced by men, and accessible to every believer who will pursue it. Just like the doctrine of forgiveness or righteousness, power has structure, depth, levels, and dimensions.

It is vital to understand that every kingdom operates by power. The Kingdom of God is no exception. Paul said, "The Kingdom of God is not in word, but in power" (1 Corinthians 4:20). If all we have are words—no matter how true—but lack the power to enforce them, we will be victims in a spiritual world ruled by forces.

The doctrine of power is God's answer to a believer's **external battles**. While doctrines like righteousness and sanctification deal with inner transformation, power equips you to **enforce victory in your environment**—in your health, finances, family, and assignment.

What Is Power?

Power is spiritual energy that causes change. It is not just strength; it is the **authorization and ability to enforce God's will**. Power is the difference between information and transformation. Between revelation and dominion.

Jesus told His disciples, "Tarry... until you are endued with power from on high" (Luke 24:49). He had taught them for years, yet that wasn't enough. Principles weren't enough. The miracles they had seen and done at his instruction weren't enough. Until power came, they were not qualified to represent Him.

Power Is a Doctrine

Just as Apostle Orokpo explained, there are core teachings every believer must master — forgiveness, righteousness, sanctification, and consecration—but those prepare you for *power*. Now, power becomes a doctrine of its own: something you study, understand, grow in, and operate by spiritual intelligence.

The goal of this doctrine is to teach you:

- What power is
- The kinds of power available
- M How power operates
- M How to grow from one level of power to another
- M How to sustain power without crashing spiritually

When you understand this doctrine, your Christianity becomes a living force. You will no longer just pray—your prayers will carry weight. You will no longer just speak—your

words will shift atmospheres.

Why the Doctrine of Power Matters

Power is what secures your **spiritual territory**. In his teachings, the Apostle warns that without power, the believer is "an endangered species." Even though you may be saved and filled with the Holy Ghost, if power is not operating in your life, **your victories will be inconsistent and circumstantial**.

Here are some reasons why this doctrine must be mastered:

- 1. Because the enemy respects only power.

 "If a strong man keeps his house, his goods are in safety. But when a stronger comes..." (Luke 11:21–22)
- 2. Because your prophetic destiny requires it.

 Jesus was called the Son of God, Creator, Light of the
 World yet He did nothing publicly until He returned
 in power (Luke 4:14).
- Because your principles alone won't help you.
 The demonic realm doesn't respond to moral goodness or deep sermons. It responds to power.

Power Is the Believer's Defense

In a spiritual world, neutrality is death—you can't afford that. If you don't carry power, you will be at the mercy of those who do. The devil has power. His agenda is clear—to steal, kill, and destroy (John 10:10). But Jesus has come that we may have **life, and life to the full**—through power.

You don't fight darkness with light speeches. You

confront it with light and fire. You don't intimidate the devil with your church attendance. He backs off when **power shows up**.

The Gospel Is Power

Paul called the gospel "the power of God unto salvation" (Romans 1:16). Not just information about God. Not just words about God. The gospel is **power**. If what you are preaching and living has no power, it is not the full gospel.

This is why Jesus didn't just teach. He healed. He cast out devils. He demonstrated the Kingdom. Christianity without demonstration is a contradiction.

You Must Grow in Power

Many believers quote Acts 1:8 — "You shall receive power..." — and assume that means they already have enough to fulfill their destiny. But as the Apostle teaches, power is given in seed form. It must be grown, developed, and expanded.

Just like electricity, power exists in **levels**. The power that turns on a lightbulb cannot run an industrial generator. The power that casts out a headache may fail against cancer, not because God is weak, but because the believer hasn't **grown** in capacity.

That's why in the coming chapters, we'll explore:

The types of power in Scripture (Exousia, Dunamis, Kratos, etc.)

- The systems of growth to move from spiritual weakness to spiritual authority

Chapter 5: The Dimensions of Power and Their Supporting Forces

"Be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might." – Ephesians 6:10

Spiritual power is not one-dimensional. Scripture reveals various kinds of power, and Apostle Michael Orokpo teaches that each of them has a corresponding support system — an underlying force that stabilizes and sustains its operation.

Let's explore these dynamic pairs, beginning with EXOUSIA and ISCHUS, and then DUNAMIS and KRATOS, before examining other dimensions of power.

1. EXOUSIA & ISCHUS

Power by Revelation and Submission

EXOUSIA – Delegated Authority

Exousia is the legal right to act on behalf of another. It's

positional power—authority conferred upon you by the finished work of Christ. The Bible says:

"As many as received Him, to them gave He power [EXOUSIA] to become the sons of God..." – John 1:12

A policeman may be small in stature, but when he raises his hand, a truck stops—not because of his physical strength, but because he carries **governmental backing**. That is EXOUSIA.

The moment you come into Christ, you are given access to function in His name. This is why Jesus said, "I give you authority to tread on serpents and scorpions..." (Luke 10:19).

But EXOUSIA operates based on **light—revelation**. Your authority is only effective to the degree of your understanding. You may carry the badge, but until you know what it means, it won't profit you.

That's why many believers confess victory but still live in defeat. They carry EXOUSIA but don't walk in it. Why? Because revelation has not taken root.

ISCHUS - Strength from Obedience

But here's the deeper truth: **EXOUSIA alone is not enough**.

There are times when the revelation is clear, yet there's no result. That's when **ISCHUS** becomes vital. ISCHUS is the **power that comes from alignment**—from obedience and yieldedness to divine authority.

"When your obedience is complete, you will be able to

avenge all disobedience." - 2 Corinthians 10:6

The Apostle teaches that ISCHUS is what ensures EXOUSIA works when **the realm of spirits begins to test your legitimacy**. The devil doesn't only ask what you know — he checks **how you live**.

If EXOUSIA is the **badge**, ISCHUS is the **integrity** behind it. Even Jesus said:

"The prince of this world comes and finds nothing in Me." (John 14:30)

Some believers make powerful declarations, but nothing moves—because their lives contradict the authority they are trying to exercise. You cannot wield the power of a kingdom you don't submit to.

No submission = No legal access = No result.

So when EXOUSIA is powered by ISCHUS—that is, **when your revelation is rooted in obedience**— you become a dangerous weapon in God's hands.

2. DUNAMIS & KRATOS

Power to Create Change and Power to Sustain It

DUNAMIS – Inherent Power to Cause Change

DUNAMIS is the most commonly known dimension of power. It is the **miracle-working ability** that resides within you—the power to cast out devils, heal the sick, shift atmospheres, and provoke immediate change.

"You shall receive power [DUNAMIS] after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you..." – Acts 1:8

This power is **generated**. It must be stirred, ignited, and released through **prayer** (praying in tongues for long periods), **fasting**, **worship**, **and spiritual intensity**.

That's why in James 5:16, we read:

"The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man makes power available."

Apostle Orokpo describes DUNAMIS as **momentary power** — it's real, explosive, and effective, but it needs to be **recharged regularly**. Like a generator, it only works while it's running.

This is why many evangelists flow in power during crusades but struggle to perform in the same way after that, because DUNAMIS was activated for a specific purpose and then fades if not sustained.

KRATOS - Sustained, Consistent Power

KRATOS is different. KRATOS is a **structural**, **enduring power**. It's not generated for moments — it is built for a **lifestyle**.

"Be strong in the Lord and in the power [KRATOS] of His might." – Ephesians 6:10

While DUNAMIS flows in moments of fire, KRATOS is built in **daily consistency**, like Jesus, who rose early every day to pray (Mark 1:35).

Where DUNAMIS is visible on the crusade platform, KRATOS is forged in the secret place. It's what makes a man dangerous, even in silence. It's what causes unbroken spiritual momentum.

Believers who carry KRATOS don't fluctuate. They don't need crises to ignite them. They live in a zone of sustained authority — because their lives have become an altar. They keep praying in tongues consistently, not just periodically. You can arise to pray for 10 hours because a need arose, but another believer keeps praying for 1 hour every day. That's the difference.

DUNAMIS will make you powerful in moments. KRATOS will make you unshakeable in life.

The mature believer does not choose between them—he carries **both**. He learns to **pray through** (to activate DUNAMIS) and to **pray consistently** (to build KRATOS).

What does it mean to pray through? It means you stay in the place of prayer, not just counting hours, but until you have a note of victory in your spirit over that situation.

Your note of victory may come as peace over that situation, or a sudden switch into praising the Lord, or joy, or bursting into spiritual laughter.

Other Dimensions of Power

Aside from these main pairs, Scripture also reveals **other kinds of power** with unique expressions:

ARCHĒ (Luke 20:20): Governing power, the ability to

- influence society and systems.
- ANAKAZO (Luke 14:23): Compelling force that overrides human will and draws people supernaturally.
- ENERGEIA (1 Corinthians 12:6): Operational power that energizes and activates other dimensions.
- MEGATOS (Ephesians 1:19): Great power the magnitude of power that raised Jesus from the dead.

These expressions will be covered in greater detail in the next chapter.

Summary

- EXOUSIA gives you authority by revelation.
- ISCHUS enforces that authority through submission.
- DUNAMIS empowers you to create change.
- KRATOS ensures you remain powerful consistently.
- The other dimensions (ARCHĒ, ANAKAZO, ENERGEO, MEGATOS) expand your influence and territory.

Power is multi-dimensional, and God wants you to walk in the **fullness** of it.

Chapter 6: Other Dimensions of Power – ARCHĒ, ANAKAZO, ENERGEO & MEGATOS

"That you may know... what is the exceeding greatness of His power to us-ward who believe, according to the working of His mighty power." – Ephesians 1:19

here is no single expression of God's power.
Scripture and experience make it clear that divine
power operates in diverse dimensions, and each serves a
unique purpose in God's agenda for men.

The Apostle identifies four critical expressions of power that many overlook: ARCHĒ, ANAKAZO, ENERGEO, and MEGATOS. These dimensions are not for entertainment or emotional stimulation—they are tools for spiritual government, kingdom advancement, and the enforcement of dominion across life's territories.

ARCHĒ – Dominion Through the Name and the Blood

The name of Jesus has **two levels of operation**, and it is the **second** that opens a man into ARCHĒ:

The Saving Dimension

"You shall call His name Jesus, for He shall save His people..." – Matthew 1:21

This is the dimension most believers know. It is reactive—used in crisis: "In Jesus' name!" And it works. But it is the lowest level.

The Ruling Dimension

"At the name of Jesus every knee shall bow..." – Philippians 2:9–10

This dimension is **not called—it is worn**. It is not a weapon you speak; it is a **realm you embody**. The Apostle explains that **you wear the name** by deep revelation until you become one with it — like Paul when the demon who molested the seven sons of Sceva spoke up "...Jesus I know, and Paul I know..." (Acts 19:14).

At this level:

- You don't say "in Jesus' name" every time—your life itself becomes a trigger.
- When you show up, it's not just you—it's Jesus showing up through you.
- Demons bow because of who you've become.

"Put on the Lord Jesus Christ..." - Romans 13:14

"Be followers of me as I follow Christ." – 1 Corinthians 11:1

This is **ARCHĒ**—when the Name becomes your atmosphere, not just your tool.

2 The Blood of Jesus — Engaged Through Communion

The Apostle corrects a common error in modern Christianity: the casual, often superstitious **pleading of the blood**.

"I plead the blood... I plead the blood... I plead the blood..."

He explains that the blood of Jesus is not a chant, and it was never used that way by the apostles in the Book of Acts. Rather, the early church engaged the blood intentionally and continually through the practice of communion.

"And they continued steadfastly... in breaking of bread, and in prayers." – Acts 2:42 "They broke bread from house to house..." – Acts 2:46

Communion was **not a ritual**. It was **a spiritual technology**—their way of accessing the life, the covering, and the covenant power in the blood. Through it, they walked in:

- Supernatural preservation
- Divine favor and territorial relevance
- Systemic influence (ARCHĒ) that made them unkillable and irresistible

The apostles never taught pleading the blood. They

taught and practiced communion—because that is how the blood speaks (Hebrews 12:24), and how its covenant is enforced.

Engaging the blood is not in your language—it's in your understanding and practice.

When you approach communion with revelation, it releases ARCHĒ—preeminent, governmental power—in your life. Not because you said the right phrase, but because you're participating in the mystery of the covenant.

ANAKAZO – Compelling Power from the Presence of God

"Go out... and compel them to come in..." – Luke 14:23

ANAKAZO is the **power of spiritual attraction**. It's what causes men to follow you, not because of eloquence, miracles, or marketing, but because of an invisible pull.

The Apostle emphasizes that this power **doesn't come by charisma**, but by **presence**.

The more time you spend with God, the more you're transformed into His image (2 Corinthians 3:18). As you become like Christ, men are drawn to you the way they were drawn to Him. This is how John the Baptist could be in the wilderness, yet multitudes came to him.

ANAKAZO cannot be faked. It is the spiritual signature of

someone who carries God.

"You may not preach, but people will still follow you. Why? You've stayed long in His presence. What you carry is what's calling them."

ANAKAZO Is Not About Eloquence or Miracles

You can preach and raise the dead, yet people remain unchanged. Miracles alone don't compel transformation.

"I've been in meetings where ten blind eyes opened... but people still went home without conviction."

"Then I've seen other meetings — no miracles, but people are weeping under conviction."

This is ANAKAZO — when the presence you carry arrests hearts.

Jesus walked by the sea and said, "Follow me,"—and successful businessmen abandoned everything to follow Him. That wasn't oratory — it was ANAKAZO.

Examples from Scripture:

- Jesus "If I be lifted up, I will draw all men to myself."
- John the Baptist He was in the wilderness, but the whole city came to him.
- Jonah One sermon brought a whole city to repentance.
- Peter After preaching, they said, "What must we do to be saved?"

These men carried ANAKAZO — not from Bible school, but from God's presence.

ENERGEO – Operational Power That Activates Potentials

"There are diversities of operations, but it is the same God who worketh [ENERGEO] all in all." – 1 Corinthians 12:6

ENERGEO is the **activating dimension** of power. It is what makes the grace on your life actually work. Many believers have callings, mantles, or spiritual deposits—but they lie dormant. ENERGEO is the spark that **energizes them into function**.

This power flows when:

- You begin to act on what you carry
- You obey divine instructions without delay
- You stay in consistent use of your gift

Like electricity, potential does nothing until it's connected to a circuit. ENERGEO is that divine circuit, making your gift sharp, accurate, and productive.

"Many believers carry potential but have no operation. They're loaded, but spiritually idle. That's a lack of ENERGEO."

MEGATOS – Power That Measures Spiritual Results

"...the exceeding greatness [MEGATOS] of His

power..." - Ephesians 1:19

MEGATOS is **not about types of power — it's about measurable weight**. It is the **force behind tangible results**, and it is the kind of power that raised Jesus from the dead.

The apostle teaches that MEGATOS is what makes spiritual potential become a physical impact. It's not enough to have power—you must have enough of it to shift realities.

"The person who scored 39 and the one who scored 2 both failed — because the pass mark was 40. That's how MEGATOS works."

This is why some believers pray for healing, but nothing changes. The issue is not wrong prayer — it's **insufficient voltage**. The demand of the situation exceeded the supply of power in your spirit.


MEGATOS answers the question:

Do you carry enough spiritual weight to cause a change?

You build it by consistent growth in all the other dimensions.

These are not academic teachings — they are **realities of spiritual dominion**. When understood and cultivated, they position a believer to not just experience power but to wield it at levels that **shift regions and awaken generations**.

Chapter 7: The Heart That Hosts Power – Virtues That Attract the Power of God

"To this man will I look, even to him that is poor and of a contrite spirit, and trembleth at My word." – Isaiah 66:2

Power does not rest on everyone equally. In the spirit, God doesn't distribute power based on emotion or desperation—He responds to alignment. And alignment is not measured in hours of prayer alone, but in the quality of heart behind the man.

The Apostle teaches that **certain virtues in a man's life invite the Spirit of Power to rest upon him**. These virtues are not "soft" traits; they are **weighty spiritual conditions** that God looks for before entrusting men with divine might.

Let's explore these core virtues — love, humility, purity, and the fear of God — and how they act as gateways to power.

1. Love – The Bond of Perfect Maturity

"Let all that you do be done in love." – 1 Corinthians 16:14 "He that dwells in love, dwells in God." – 1 John 4:16

Love is the highest law in the spirit realm. It is more than kindness—it is the **very essence of God's nature**. And when a man walks in true love, he gains access to **God's depth**.

The Apostle teaches that love is not just a requirement for relationship; it is a **qualification for weighty kingdom assignments**. Why?

Because power without love becomes **manipulation**. Authority without love becomes **abuse**. Only a man constrained by love can be trusted with the power to shape destinies without seeking self-glory.

2. Humility – The Power to Stay Low

"God resists the proud but gives grace to the humble." – James 4:6

Moses was **the meekest man on earth**—and he wielded terrifying power. The Red Sea obeyed him. The earth opened at his command. Why? Because he had no agenda apart from God's.

The Apostle reveals that **humility is not thinking less of yourself — it is dying to your own ambition**. God can use a humble man because he will never touch the glory.

Pride is a disqualifier in the spirit. Heaven watches the posture of your heart. If power will exalt you instead of Christ, God will withhold it—not out of cruelty, but out of mercy.

Humility is what keeps powerful men safe.

3. Purity – The Vessel That Can Carry Fire

"Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God." – Matthew 5:8 "Flee youthful lusts... that you may be a vessel unto honour." – 2 Timothy 2:22

Joseph's greatness wasn't just in his dreams—it was in his **purity**. He rejected Potiphar's wife not just because it was wrong, but because he feared God. That singular act preserved his destiny and unlocked national relevance.

Purity is more than sexual discipline. It is **the absence of pollution** in your motives, your pursuits, and your lifestyle. A pure vessel can carry sensitive assignments. Impure ones leak the oil.

Power cannot dwell where impurity rules. The Holy Spirit is called the *Holy* Spirit for a reason. He empowers clean vessels.

4. The Fear of God – Foundation of Spiritual Weight

"The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." – Proverbs 9:10

"To him that fears My name shall the Sun of Righteousness arise with healing in His wings." –

Malachi 4.2

The fear of God is not terror—it is **deep reverence**. It is the awareness that God is watching, weighing, and responding.

It is the foundation for spiritual responsibility. It is what kept men like Daniel and Joseph stable in power. It is what God seeks before He reveals His secrets.

"The secret of the Lord is with them that fear Him." (Psalm 25:14)

The fear of God restrains you when no one is watching. It governs your private life, which qualifies you for **public** authority.

Summary: God's Power Rests on Certain Hearts

God is not just looking for the skilled or the anointed—He is searching for:

- Lovers who will not turn His power into performance.
- The humble who will not steal His glory.
- The pure who will not contaminate His Spirit.
- The reverent who will not trade sacred things for gain.

If you want power, start with the **heart**. Before you seek mantles, gifts, or fire, ask: "Lord, is my heart a place where power can rest?"

Chapter 8: How to Grow in Power

"Be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might." – Ephesians 6:10

Power doesn't just fall on people and stay there. In the kingdom, power grows—and it grows through understanding, practice, and alignment with spiritual laws.

Now, while *receiving* the Holy Ghost gives you access to power (Acts 1:8), walking in sustained, usable, and increasing power requires **growth**. The seed of power must be cultivated into stature. This chapter explores how to do that.

We will focus on three major power-building systems:

- 1. Tongues that lead to transformation
- 2. The discipline of both praying through and praying consistently
- 3. Building and retaining spiritual energy

1. From Tongues to Transformation

"He that speaketh in an unknown tongue edifieth himself..." – 1 Corinthians 14:4

Speaking in tongues is one of the greatest spiritual technologies for growing in power. Yet many believers either don't speak in tongues or speak in tongues for years without transformation. Why?

Because tongues are not magical; they are **spiritual triggers** — designed to **build capacity**, **download mysteries**, and **ignite transformation**. Tongues generate power, but what you *do* with that power determines your outcome.

The Apostle reveals three dimensions of tongues:

- Tongues for devotion personal intimacy and communion with God
- Tongues for warfare confronting resistance in the spirit
- Tongues for transformation shifting your spiritual stature

It is this third kind that causes a man to become **another kind of being**. Tongues are not just to "feel good"—they are to **edify**, meaning *to construct* or *to build*. The more you engage with revelation and alignment while praying in tongues, the more you grow in power.

Tongues without focus leads to noise.

Tongues with understanding leads to transformation.

2. Prayer: Praying Through vs. Praying Consistently

There are two systems of prayer that contribute to your growth in power:

Praying Through

This is **burden-driven, intensive prayer**—the kind that **breaks barriers** and births breakthroughs. It is what the old saints called **"praying until something happens."** Jesus prayed this way in Gethsemane. Elijah prayed this way until rain came.

Praying through produces:

- Breakthrough in spiritual atmospheres
- Activation of dormant graces
- Deep encounters with the Spirit

It is violent. It is sacrificial. But it is also **seasonal**—God draws you into it when something must shift urgently.

Praying Consistently

This is **daily alignment**, the kind of prayer that **builds structure and power over time**. It is not always emotional, but it is powerful in persistence. This is the kind of prayer Daniel practiced—*three times a day, every day*.

While praying through opens doors, **praying consistently keeps them open**.

The Apostle explains that **occasional intensity cannot replace daily discipline**. If you want to be perpetually powerful, you must pray whether you feel like it or not. Over time, power becomes your atmosphere.

A man who prays when he feels like it is emotional. A man who prays whether or not he feels like it is dangerous.

3. Building Spiritual Energy

Power is spiritual energy. And just like physical strength, it can be measured, spent, and replenished.

Jude 1:20 says:

"But ye, beloved, building up yourselves on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Ghost..."

This means your spirit can be *built up*—like a reservoir. You can accumulate power over time. When your energy is high:

- Revelations flow easily.
- M Healing is swift.
- Discernment is sharp.
- Resistance in the spirit is crushed quickly.

But when your spiritual energy is low:

- Your mind is foggy.
- Temptation overpowers you.
- Your words carry no weight.
- You become vulnerable to attacks.

How do you build energy?

- Pray in tongues intentionally.
- Soak in the Word while praying.
- Engage in long hours of waiting and worship.
- Fast regularly to quiet the flesh.
- Stay under corporate anointings and impartations.

The Apostle notes that **spiritual energy is cumulative**—if you stay consistent, your spiritual capacity grows until your

presence alone carries weight.

Power is not always in what you do. Sometimes it's in who you've become.

Summary

To grow in power:

- Move from *tongues as exercise* to *tongues as transformation*.
- Learn when to pray through and how to pray consistently.
- Focus on **building and managing spiritual energy**, so your life doesn't fluctuate.

Power is not just for preachers—it is for **witnesses**, and every believer is called to be one (Acts 1:8). But witnesses must first be **empowered**. And empowerment is not a one-time event—it's a **lifestyle**.

Chapter 9: Walking in Power Daily

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He hath anointed me..." – Luke 4:18

Power was never meant to be a once-in-a-while experience. In the kingdom, power is designed to be a lifestyle. You weren't called to visit the supernatural occasionally—you were designed to live there daily.

Unfortunately, many believers treat power like a spiritual event. They fast, feel fire, get results—and then return to powerlessness until the next revival. This is not the pattern Jesus modeled. After He returned in power from the wilderness (Luke 4:14), He walked in consistent dominion until His death.

So how do you walk in power daily—not just momentarily?

1. Power Flows Best Through Simplicity and Consistency

Power is not sustained by spiritual drama. It's sustained by **disciplined intimacy** with God. Many want fire, but they don't want **routine**. Yet it is in the routine—daily prayer,

meditation, obedience—that power settles into your soul.

Daniel didn't wait for warfare to pray. He prayed three times a day—for years. That was how his power became **territorial**.

Walking in power daily requires:

- A daily altar of fellowship (even when you don't "feel" it)
- Sensitivity to the Holy Spirit in mundane moments
- The discipline of remaining spiritual even when nothing looks spiritual

You don't feel power. You align, and power flows.

2. Power Is Maintained by Purity and Brokenness

The fastest way to lose power is to become careless with your heart. Sin breaks spiritual circuits. Pride repels grace. Bitterness and offense short-circuit the anointing.

The Apostle repeatedly emphasizes that **sensitivity is greater than sensation**. God can stop flowing through a man and still allow the crowd to cheer him—but the Spirit has left. This is how men become **empty and loud**.

To walk in power daily:

- Guard your purity like your life depends on it—because it does.
- Keep your heart humble, no matter how powerful you become.
- Stay repentant and quick to obey. Brokenness is magnetic to God.

If you can still weep before God, you are still usable by God.

3. Live With a Supernatural Consciousness

Many lose power not because they sinned—but because they became **natural again**. They stopped expecting God to move through them. They stopped leaning into the Spirit.

Walking in power requires a **spiritual mindedness**. You must:

- Expect divine interruption.
- Stay aware of spiritual atmospheres.
- Know that your words, hands, and presence are loaded with possibilities.

Jesus said, "The words I speak to you are Spirit and life." That wasn't just because He was the Son of God. It was because He was aware of the divine flow within Him.

When you believe that God is with you and within you—power flows through you.

4. Refuel Constantly

Power leaks. Every interaction, every ministration, every warfare withdraws from your reservoir. That's why Jesus always withdrew to pray—not because He lacked power, but because He knew it must be replenished.

Walking in power daily requires:

- Constant recharging (through tongues, Word, worship)
- Periodic **separations** for deeper encounters

Listening to God daily, not just when you need direction

You don't need a crowd to refill. You just need a quiet space and a hungry heart.

The more you spend time with God, the more power becomes your default state.

To walk in power daily:

- Build spiritual routines, not emotional highs.
- Guard your purity, humility, and sensitivity.
- Stay supernatural in your thinking.
- Refuel your spirit constantly.

Chapter 10: Pitfalls – The Illusion of Power Without Alignment

"Many will say to me in that day, 'Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, and cast out devils?'... and I will say, 'I never knew you.'" – Matthew 7:22–23

Power can be deceptive when it is divorced from alignment. It can create an illusion of intimacy, maturity, or divine approval. Men can move crowds, cast out demons, heal the sick—and still be out of sync with God.

This is one of the greatest spiritual dangers of our generation.

God can flow through a man for the sake of others, not because that man is aligned. Anointing is not proof of approval. If you mistake gifts for growth, or results for righteousness, you may fall into the trap of power without alignment.

1. When Performance Replaces Presence

There is a subtle shift that happens in the hearts of many gifted people. They begin with a burden to seek God. They pray, fast, yield—and then God begins to use them.

But over time, they begin to prioritize **performance over presence**. They pray less, but minister more. They no longer wait on God; they wait on opportunities. Their spiritual life becomes public, but their private life begins to rot.

The power still flows—but God is **no longer with them** in fellowship. He's only moving *through them* for the sake of the people.

This is how men become famous in the spirit, yet strangers to God.

Never confuse usefulness with approval. God used Pharaoh too.

2. Gifting Without Character

Samson carried terrifying power. He tore lions, lifted city gates, killed armies—yet his personal life was in ruins. He lived in disobedience, fornicated without remorse, and finally ended in tragedy.

Why? Because his gift outgrew his character.

The Apostle warns that power will magnify **whatever is inside you**:

- If you are humble, power will amplify your yieldedness.
- If you are proud, power will inflate your rebellion.
- If you are impure, power will fast-track your destruction.

Power without alignment makes men reckless.

3. When the Vessel Becomes the Focus

Another pitfall is the temptation to **take glory**. When people begin to celebrate the man instead of the God behind the man, power becomes corrupted.

This was the sin of Herod. He gave a speech, and the people said, "This is the voice of a god!" — and because he didn't redirect the glory, God struck him down (Acts 12:21–23).

When men begin to build empires around themselves, when ministry becomes self-promotion, when power becomes a **tool for manipulation**, the Spirit of God begins to withdraw—even if the outward results continue.

God will never share His glory.

If your name grows louder than the name of Jesus, your ministry is already in danger.

4. Ignoring the State of Your Soul

Many powerful people ignore the health of their inner man because they're too busy "doing things for God." But what does it profit you to raise the dead and lose your soul? Your **spirit must grow faster than your gift**. Otherwise, the day your soul is tested—by lust, pride, offense, or isolation—you'll crash. Not because you weren't anointed, but because you were **empty inside**.

Daily intimacy with God is not optional. It is what keeps power from becoming poison.

Summary

The greatest pitfall in power is to move for God without walking with God.

Avoid the illusion of power by:

- M Keeping your private walk sacred
- Measuring success by obedience, not just results
- Never outgrowing brokenness and intimacy
- Prioritizing character above gifting
- Always pointing men back to Jesus

Remember: God's real pleasure is not in what you *do* for Him, but in **who you become** with Him.

To become a carrier of divine power, you must:

- Pursue love, humility, purity, and the fear of God
- Master the use of tongues as a tool for transformation
- Build spiritual energy through consistent prayer and intimacy
- Avoid the illusion of success without genuine alignment

Power is not for status—it is for service. It is for **kingdom enforcement**, **territorial dominion**, and **the liberation of men**.

God Is Still Empowering Men

The Holy Spirit is not looking for perfect people—He is looking for available, empty, broken vessels. People like:

- Moses, who was meek
- Joseph, who was pure
- Daniel, who feared God
- Jesus, who walked in total submission

He wants to use people who **burn with hunger**, who are dissatisfied with ordinary Christianity—people who want to bring God's reality into their world.

Will you be that man? That woman? That vessel?

Your Generation Awaits Your Rising

"The earnest expectation of creation waits for the manifestation of the sons of God." – Romans 8:19

You are not just a churchgoer. You are not just a

worshipper. You are a **kingdom agent**, sent into time and territory to represent God. But you cannot do this without **power**.

Your generation will not believe words alone. They will believe **when power flows**. When your life becomes proof that God is real. When your words carry weight, your hands carry healing, and your presence shifts atmospheres.

This is not hype. It is your calling. But it won't happen by chance. It will happen when you say:

"Lord, I don't just want to read about revival. I want to host it."
