Seven Reasons Why Every Soul Is Precious to God

Understanding the **true worth of a soul** is critical for anyone involved in soul-winning. According to Apostle Michael Orokpo, a soul is not just a person—he or she is a **divine asset**, and has a value that surpasses every material possession in the world.

Below are **seven scripturally grounded reasons** why every soul is of inestimable value in the eyes of God:

1. A Soul Is Worth More Than the World

Jesus asked in Mark 8:36, “What shall it profit a man if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul?”

This reveals that **one soul is more valuable than all global wealth combined**—more than gold, nations, power, or fame. If you had everything but lost your soul, you’ve lost everything. This is Heaven’s value system.

11. **Eternal Legacy** – Souls won become your reward forever.
12. **Access to God’s Presence** – Greater nearness to God based on kingdom productivity.

Soul Winning as Warfare

“Many will come to Christ because angels helped orchestrate the encounter.” —Apostle Michael Orokpo

5. Raising Fellow Laborers

Jesus said in Matthew 9:38, *“Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth laborers into his harvest.”*

No one can reach a city alone. Pray for more hands, more hearts, and more voices to rise. A praying soul winner multiplies his impact by raising others.

6. Financial Provision for Kingdom Spread

The Gospel is free, but its **transportation is costly**. Prayer activates divine provision—resources to print materials, support missions, travel, and establish platforms.

“Without provision, many visions will die in the heart of the soul winner.” —Apostle Michael Orokpo

You are not begging for money—you are aligning with kingdom economics to fund eternal purposes.

The Role of Travail and Spiritual Burden

Beyond strategic prayers, soul winners must know **travail**.

Galatians 4:19 says, *“My little children, of whom I travail in birth again until Christ be formed in you...”*

Travail is **spiritual labor**—groaning, weeping, and contending for souls as though giving birth. It is not casual; it is costly. But it is this burden that breaks the hardest hearts and births revival.

“If your heart does not break for the lost, your prayers will lack fire.” —Apostle Michael Orokpo

Real soul winners cry before they preach. They intercede before they invite. They weep before they win.

Chapter Eight: Preaching the Gospel with Clarity and Power

How to Explain the Gospel Simply and Powerfully

The Gospel is not meant to be complicated. It is **God’s message of salvation**, and it must be presented with clarity and urgency. Avoiding Intellectualism in Evangelism

One of the great hindrances to effective soul winning is **intellectualism**—trying to sound deep or smart instead of being clear and Spirit-led. Paul said, *“My speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man’s wisdom...”* (1 Corinthians 2:4).

“You’re not a lecturer. You are a carrier of the most important message on earth.” —Apostle Michael Orokpo

Avoid:

- Complex theology
- Philosophical arguments
- Unnecessary big grammar
- Debates that lead nowhere

The goal is not to win an argument, but to **win a soul**

Letting the Holy Spirit Convict Hearts

Conviction is not your job—it is the Holy Spirit's. Jesus said in John 16:8, *"And when He is come, He will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment."*

Your duty is to **speak the message clearly**. The Spirit will do the **invisible work** in the heart.

***"Don't manipulate emotions. Preach truth. The Holy Ghost knows how to pierce the heart."* —Apostle Michael Orokpo**

Rely on Him. Before you preach, **pray in the Spirit**. As you speak, **listen inwardly**. When He leads, follow. When He convicts, back off and let Him finish His work.

Chapter Nine: Spirit-Filled Administration and Power Demonstration

Going Beyond Words to Walk in Power

Evangelism was never meant to be mere speech. Paul declared in 1 Corinthians 2:4, *“My speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man’s wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power.”* The Gospel must not only be preached—it must be **proven**.

“We don’t just preach Christ—we manifest Him.” —Apostle Michael Orokpo

Words are important, but they must be **backed by power**. People in darkness are not moved by philosophy—they respond to the **supernatural authority** of the Holy Spirit flowing through a yielded vessel.

“You are not sent alone. The Holy Spirit is your power source in evangelism.” —Apostle Michael Orokpo

To minister under His influence:

- Pray in tongues to stir your spirit
- Be sensitive to His promptings
- Speak as He gives utterance
- Allow Him to interrupt your plan if needed

Miracles do not save, but they **point to the Savior**. Use them wisely. Let power **open the heart**, then let the Gospel **enter**.

Practical Examples from Scripture and Real Life

Throughout the Bible, evangelism was marked by **power encounters**:

- **Jesus** healed the sick, cast out demons, and forgave sins.
- **Philip** in Samaria saw demons scream and flee (Acts 8).
- **Peter** healed the lame, and thousands believed (Acts 3–4).
- **Paul** cast out spirits and raised the dead, and cities turned to God.

Even today, people come to Christ through:

- Instant healing at bus stops
- Prophetic messages in marketplaces
- Spirit-led moments on public transport
- Deliverance from bondage in a single prayer
