This book was written to help you understand healing from a legal and redemptive perspective. It explains why healing belongs to you, how to receive it, and how to move beyond occasional healing into a lifestyle of divine health.

The teachings here are simple, direct, and practical. They are meant to help you shift from hoping to be healed into knowing that you are healed in Christ.

As you read, approach the truth with humility and faith. Let understanding produce confidence, and let confidence produce results.

Introduction

Healing is not God's reaction to sickness. Healing is God's provision before sickness ever appeared. God never designed man to live with disease, weakness, or infirmity.

Many believers approach healing emotionally. They pray when symptoms appear and relax when the pain goes away. But healing is deeper than relief. It is a spiritual reality established by Christ.

This book will help you understand healing as part of redemption. You will learn why sickness has no legal right in your body and how to enforce what Christ has already done.

Chapter 1: God's Original Design for Man

God did not create man to live with sickness, weakness, or disease. Sickness was never part of God's idea. From the beginning, God designed man to live from divine life and to function in dominion.

If you want to understand healing, you must first understand how God created man. Healing makes sense only when you see that sickness is an intruder and not a feature of human existence.

Man Was Created for Glory, Not Sickness

When God created man, He created him in His own image and likeness. This was not poetic language. It was a statement of nature and function.

"And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion..." — Genesis 1:26 (KJV)

God's image does not carry sickness. God's likeness does not accommodate disease. Everything God is, man was designed to reflect. Man was created to function from God's life.

Sickness did not exist in Eden. Weakness was not part of man's experience. There was no provision for hospitals, pain, or decay. Man lived by divine life.

This means sickness is not normal. It is an abnormal condition that entered later.

"Sickness is not a human condition; it is a satanic intrusion." — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Dominion Was Man's Starting Point

God did not ask man to earn authority. He gave it to him from the beginning. Dominion was not a reward for obedience; it was man's original position.

"And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion..." — Genesis 1:28 (KJV)

Man was created to rule, not to struggle. He was designed to command his environment, not to be subject to it.

Sickness represents something ruling over the body. That alone tells you sickness contradicts God's original order.

If sickness rules your body, something is out of alignment with God's design.

God's Life Was Man's Sustenance

Man did not live by food alone. He lived by the life of God. As long as man remained connected to God, decay had no access to his body.

The Bible shows us that God breathed His own life into man:

"And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul." — Genesis 2:7 (KJV)

That breath was not oxygen alone. It was divine life. Man was animated by God's life.

As long as that life sustained man, sickness could not exist. Disease thrives where divine life is absent.

> *“Where the life of God dominates, sickness has no permission to stay.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo*

Sickness Is an Enemy, Not a Tool

Some people think God uses sickness to teach lessons or humble believers. That idea contradicts Scripture and God’s character.

“The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.” — John 10:10 (KJV)

Jesus identified sickness and destruction as the work of the enemy. He never credited God with sickness.

Jesus healed the sick everywhere He went. He never told anyone to keep their sickness for spiritual growth.

“If sickness were from God, Jesus would not be fighting it everywhere He went.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Healing Restores God’s Original Order

Healing is not God changing His mind. Healing is God restoring His original design.

When God heals, He is enforcing what should have been from the beginning.

“Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever.” — Hebrews 13:8 (KJV)

If God never changed, then sickness was never His plan. Healing simply brings man back into alignment with God’s original intent.

This means you are not asking God to do something new when you seek healing. You are enforcing what already belongs to you.

Why This Understanding Matters

If you believe sickness is normal, you will tolerate it. If you believe sickness is God's will, you will submit to it.

But when you understand that sickness was never part of God's design, boldness rises in your heart. Faith becomes firm. Resistance becomes natural.

"You cannot resist what you think is permitted." — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Healing begins with understanding. Until your mind aligns with God's original design, your faith will remain unstable.

In the next chapter, you will see how sickness entered the human experience and why it gained legal access to man.

Chapter 2: How Sickness Entered the Human Race

Sickness did not begin with God. It began with disobedience. To understand sickness, you must understand the fall of man and the legal changes that followed it.

God created man with authority and divine life, but that authority could be transferred. When Adam disobeyed God, something spiritual changed. Man lost access to God's life and opened the door to death.

Adam's Disobedience Opened a Legal Door

God gave Adam one clear instruction. As long as Adam obeyed God, he remained under divine life and authority. The moment Adam disobeyed, he violated a spiritual law.

"But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die." — Genesis 2:17 (KJV)

Adam did not fall down dead physically that day, but death entered his spirit immediately. Separation from God began. From that moment, decay gained access to the human body.

Death is the foundation of sickness. Where death reigns, sickness follows.

"Sickness is sustained by death. Remove death, and sickness has no root." — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Death Passed Upon All Men

Adam was the head of the human race. When he fell, humanity fell with him. His condition became the condition of all men born after him.

The Bible explains this clearly:

“Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned.” — Romans 5:12 (KJV)

Sin opened the door. Death came through that door. Sickness came as a product of death.

This means sickness is not random. It operates on legal grounds. It came because something spiritual changed in man’s nature.

Satan Became an Oppressor, Not an Owner

When Adam disobeyed God, he submitted to Satan’s suggestion. By doing that, he handed over authority.

The Bible calls Satan an oppressor, not a creator:

“How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him.” — Acts 10:38 (KJV)

Satan did not create sickness. He uses it as a tool of oppression. He only had access because Adam lost his legal standing.

“Satan does not have authority; he exploits legality.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

This is why sickness is described as oppression. It is not ownership. It is illegal activity sustained by broken spiritual alignment.

Why God Did Not Stop the Fall

God did not stop Adam because God honors the authority He gives. Adam was not a robot. He was a ruler.

God does not violate legal structures, even when man makes wrong choices. Instead, God provides a redemptive solution.

That solution was Christ.

The Curse Affected the Body

After the fall, God described the consequences of sin. The earth became hostile, and the human body became subject to decay.

"In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return." — Genesis 3:19 (KJV)

Returning to dust is decay. Decay is the environment where sickness thrives.

Man began to live by survival instead of divine life.

Why Healing Must Be Legal

Because sickness entered legally, it must be dealt with legally. God could not just feel sorry for man and remove sickness. A legal problem requires a legal solution.

This is why redemption was necessary.

*“Until the legal issue of sin was settled, sickness had a right to stay.” —
Apostle Michael Orokpo*

Understanding how sickness entered the human race helps you understand why Christ had to come as a man, live without sin, and die on the cross.

In the next chapter, you will see how the finished work of Christ completely dealt with sin, death, and Satan’s authority.

Chapter 3: The Two Root Causes of Sickness

Sickness does not exist without a cause. The Bible never presents sickness as random or mysterious. According to Scripture and spiritual law, sickness operates from identifiable roots.

Apostle Michael Orokpo teaches that sickness is sustained by two major roots. Until these roots are addressed, symptoms will continue to return even after prayer.

Healing becomes consistent when the root is dealt with, not just the pain.

Sin as a Legal Root of Sickness

Sin is the first root of sickness. Sin does not always mean personal wrongdoing. It first refers to the fallen nature that entered humanity through Adam.

“For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God.” — Romans 3:23 (KJV)

When man fell short of God’s glory, he fell short of God’s life. That loss created legal room for sickness to operate.

Sickness thrives where God’s life is absent. It draws strength from spiritual separation.

“Sin gives sickness a legal voice in the body.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

This explains why forgiveness and justification are central to healing. Until the sin issue is settled, sickness still has a legal argument.

Satan as an Oppressor

The second root of sickness is satanic oppression. Satan does not own man, but he looks for legal access to afflict the body.

The Bible clearly identifies sickness as oppression:

“How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him.” — Acts 10:38 (KJV)

Jesus did not heal sickness as a medical condition alone. He healed it as an oppression.

“Satan sustains sickness where legality exists.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

This means sickness is not only biological; it is spiritual. Medical treatment may manage symptoms, but only spiritual authority removes oppression.

Symptoms Are Not the Real Problem

Many believers focus on symptoms. Pain, weakness, and discomfort become the main concern. But symptoms are effects, not causes.

When you only address symptoms, sickness returns because the root is still active.

Jesus demonstrated this when He addressed the spiritual root behind physical conditions.

“And when Jesus saw their faith, he said unto the sick of the palsy, Son, thy sins be forgiven thee.” — Mark 2:5 (KJV)

Jesus dealt with sin before addressing paralysis. He removed the legal ground before commanding physical restoration.

Why Prayer Alone Is Sometimes Not Enough

Prayer is powerful, but prayer without understanding can be inconsistent. If the root is not addressed, prayer becomes repetition instead of enforcement.

Apostle Michael Orokpo emphasizes that understanding produces accuracy in spiritual engagement.

“Power answers to legality and understanding.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

When legality is removed and authority is enforced, healing becomes stable.

The Role of Redemption in Healing

Because sin and satanic oppression are the two roots of sickness, healing must deal with both.

This is why Christ had to:

- Settle the sin problem
- Defeat Satan’s authority
- Restore God’s life to man

Until redemption addressed these roots, sickness could not be permanently removed.

The next chapter explains how the finished work of Christ dealt completely with these two roots and established healing as a legal reality for the believer.

Chapter 4: The Finished Work of Christ Explained

Healing did not begin when Jesus healed the sick. Healing began when Jesus finished His work on the cross. Everything Jesus did before the cross pointed to what He would complete through His death, burial, and resurrection.

If you do not understand the finished work of Christ, you will keep approaching healing as something God may or may not do. Understanding the finished work settles the matter.

What Does “It Is Finished” Mean?

When Jesus was on the cross, He made a powerful declaration.

“When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, he said, It is finished: and he bowed his head, and gave up the ghost.” — John 19:30 (KJV)

This statement was not emotional. It was legal. Jesus announced that everything required to redeem man had been fully completed.

Sin was judged. Death was defeated. Satan’s authority was stripped.

“Healing is not something God is still working on. It was concluded at the cross.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Christ Took the Sin Nature Away

The first root of sickness was sin. Jesus dealt with sin completely.

“For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him.” — 2 Corinthians 5:21 (KJV)

Jesus did not just forgive sins. He took sin away by becoming sin in our place. This removed sin as a legal root.

If sin is removed, sickness loses its legal voice.

Christ Destroyed the Power of Death

Death sustained sickness. Jesus confronted death directly.

“Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, he also himself likewise took part of the same; that through death he might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil.” — Hebrews 2:14 (KJV)

Jesus did not negotiate with death. He destroyed its authority.

“Once death was defeated, sickness lost its backbone.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Christ Publicly Defeated Satan

Satan’s authority depended on legality. When Jesus dealt with sin and death, Satan lost his legal grounds.

“And having spoiled principalities and powers, he made a shew of them openly, triumphing over them in it.” — Colossians 2:15 (KJV)

Satan was not defeated privately. He was defeated openly.

This means sickness no longer has legal backing in the believer's body.

Healing Is Now a Legal Reality

Because the finished work addressed sin, death, and Satan, healing is no longer a request. It is an entitlement.

"Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows... and with his stripes we are healed." — Isaiah 53:4-5 (KJV)

Healing was part of what Jesus bore. It is included in redemption.

"You are not trying to be healed. You are enforcing what Christ already finished." — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Why Understanding the Finished Work Matters

If you do not understand the finished work, you will keep asking God to do what He has already done.

Understanding produces confidence. Confidence produces authority. Authority produces results.

The finished work of Christ is the foundation of divine health.

Chapter 5: Healing as a Legal Reality

Healing is not based on emotions, feelings, or circumstances. Healing is based on law. Until you understand healing as a legal reality, you will keep treating it as a favor instead of a right.

Apostle Michael Orokpo emphasizes that the spiritual realm responds to legality. God does not act outside spiritual law, and Satan cannot operate without legal ground. Healing works the same way.

Healing Is Not a Request

Many believers approach healing by begging God. They plead, cry, and hope God will show mercy. But healing is not something you beg for. It is something you enforce.

“Bless the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits: Who forgiveth all thine iniquities; who healeth all thy diseases.” — Psalm 103:2–3 (KJV)

Forgiveness and healing are listed together because they flow from the same legal foundation. If forgiveness is not begged for, healing should not be begged for either.

“You don’t beg for what was legally secured.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Healing Is the Children’s Bread

Jesus made it clear that healing belongs to the covenant people of God.

“And she said, Truth, Lord: yet the dogs eat of the crumbs which fall from their masters’ table. Then Jesus answered and said unto her, O woman, great is thy faith: be it unto thee even as thou wilt.” — Matthew 15:27-28 (KJV)

Jesus referred to healing as bread. Bread is not a luxury. It is basic provision.

If healing is bread, then sickness is abnormal for the believer.

“Healing is covenant provision, not special intervention.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Authority Is Central to Healing

Healing flows through authority. Authority comes from understanding your position in Christ.

“Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you.” — Luke 10:19 (KJV)

Jesus did not tell believers to negotiate with sickness. He gave them authority over it.

Sickness responds to authority, not sympathy.

Why Some Healings Do Not Last

When healing is received emotionally but not legally, symptoms return. Feelings change, but law remains.

If your healing is based only on excitement or atmosphere, it will fade. But if it is based on legal truth, it remains.

“Anything not established legally cannot be sustained spiritually.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Faith Enforces Legal Reality

Faith is not trying to convince God. Faith agrees with God and enforces what He has said.

“And this is the confidence that we have in him, that, if we ask any thing according to his will, he heareth us.” — 1 John 5:14 (KJV)

Faith stands on what God has already done. When faith speaks, sickness listens.

Healing Is Maintained by Understanding

Understanding keeps healing stable. When you know why healing belongs to you, doubt loses its power.

Ignorance weakens faith. Understanding strengthens authority.

“Light is what sustains victory.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Healing as a legal reality means you no longer hope for healing. You stand in it.

Chapter 6: Faith, Understanding, and Engagement

Faith does not work in isolation. Faith works with understanding, and understanding leads to proper spiritual engagement. When any of these is missing, healing becomes inconsistent.

Apostle Michael Orokpo teaches that many believers believe correctly but engage wrongly. They have faith, but they lack understanding. Or they understand, but they do not engage. All three must work together.

Faith Is a Response to Truth

Faith is not positive thinking. Faith is a response to revealed truth. When truth enters the heart, faith rises naturally.

“So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.” — Romans 10:17 (KJV)

Faith grows when truth is understood, not when emotions are stirred.

“Faith does not respond to desire; it responds to revelation.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Understanding Gives Faith Stability

Many believers receive healing but lose it because their faith was not built on understanding.

“Through wisdom is an house builded; and by understanding it is established.” — Proverbs 24:3 (KJV)

Understanding establishes faith. When you know why healing belongs to you, doubt loses its grip.

Ignorance weakens faith, but understanding sustains victory.

Engagement Is the Application of Authority

Engagement is where faith and understanding are expressed. It is the act of enforcing spiritual truth.

Jesus demonstrated engagement when He spoke directly to sickness, storms, and devils.

“And Jesus rebuked the fever; and it left her.” — Luke 4:39 (KJV)

Jesus did not ask the fever to leave. He rebuked it. That is engagement.

“Engagement is not noise; it is accuracy.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Why Confession Matters

Confession is not repetition. Confession is alignment. When you speak God’s Word, you align your mouth with legal truth.

“Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering.” — Hebrews 10:23 (KJV)

What you say consistently determines what you sustain.

Engagement Requires Persistence

Some battles do not yield instantly. This does not mean faith has failed. It means engagement must continue.

“Men ought always to pray, and not to faint.” — Luke 18:1 (KJV)

Persistence is not desperation. It is firmness.

> *“Consistency is proof of conviction.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo*

When Faith, Understanding, and Engagement Align

When faith is informed, understanding is clear, and engagement is accurate, healing becomes consistent.

You stop reacting to symptoms and start enforcing truth. You stop hoping and start standing.

This alignment moves the believer from occasional healing into stable victory.

Chapter 7: Healing by Understanding and Healing by the Anointing

God heals in different ways, but He does not contradict Himself. Healing by understanding and healing by the anointing are not opposites. They are complementary.

Many believers experience healing through the anointing without understanding. Others walk in healing through understanding even when there is no strong manifestation. Both are valid, but one produces more stability than the other.

Apostle Michael Orokpo teaches that the highest form of healing is not emotional release but spiritual understanding.

Healing by the Anointing

Healing by the anointing happens when God's power is released through a vessel or an atmosphere. This kind of healing is often accompanied by strong manifestations.

"And the whole multitude sought to touch him: for there went virtue out of him, and healed them all." — Luke 6:19 (KJV)

Here, people were healed because virtue flowed. They did not necessarily understand what was happening, but power was released.

Healing by the anointing is real and scriptural. God uses it to demonstrate His power and compassion.

> “The anointing can heal you even when you don’t understand much.”

— Apostle Michael Orokpo

The Limitation of Healing by the Anointing Alone

While healing by the anointing is powerful, it is not always stable if understanding is absent.

Many people receive healing in meetings and lose it later because their minds were not renewed.

“My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge.” — Hosea 4:6 (KJV)

Without knowledge, victory leaks.

“Power can give you an experience, but understanding gives you possession.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Healing by Understanding

Healing by understanding happens when truth enters the heart and aligns the believer with legal reality. Symptoms leave because legality has changed.

“And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.” — John 8:32 (KJV)

Here, freedom comes through knowing, not through a manifestation.

Healing by understanding is quiet but strong. It does not depend on atmosphere. It depends on truth.

Why Understanding Produces Stability

Understanding changes how you think, speak, and respond. When symptoms appear, you do not panic. You enforce what you know.

“Be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind.” — Romans 12:2 (KJV)

A renewed mind sustains healing.

How the Two Work Together

God often uses the anointing to introduce believers to healing. He uses understanding to keep them healed.

The anointing can start a healing, but understanding completes it.

“The anointing can bring healing, but light is what keeps it.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Moving from Experience to Lifestyle

God does not want you to depend on meetings alone for healing. He wants healing to become your normal experience.

When understanding grows, healing becomes a lifestyle, not an event.

This is how believers move from occasional breakthroughs to consistent victory.

In the next chapter, you will learn how to practically receive healing and enforce it in your daily life.

Chapter 8: How to Receive Your Healing

Receiving healing is not complicated. It becomes difficult only when people approach it emotionally instead of legally. Healing responds to understanding, authority, and proper engagement.

Apostle Michael Orokpo teaches that many believers delay their healing because they focus on feelings rather than truth. Healing begins when you align with what Christ has already done.

Stop Focusing on Symptoms

Symptoms are real, but they are not final. When you focus on symptoms, you empower them. When you focus on truth, symptoms lose authority.

“While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen: for the things which are seen are temporal; but the things which are not seen are eternal.” — 2 Corinthians 4:18 (KJV)

Symptoms are temporary. Truth is eternal.

“Whatever you give your attention to gains authority over you.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Deal With the Root, Not Just the Pain

Healing becomes permanent when the root is addressed. Pain may leave temporarily, but if the legal issue remains, symptoms can return.

> *“And when Jesus saw their faith, he said unto the sick of the palsy, Son, thy sins be forgiven thee.” — Mark 2:5 (KJV)*

Jesus addressed the root before addressing the result.

Understanding justification and righteousness is key to receiving lasting healing.

Speak to the Mountain

Healing is enforced through words. Silence gives sickness room to stay.

“For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith.” — Mark 11:23 (KJV)

Jesus did not say pray to the mountain. He said speak to it.

“Authority is expressed through words.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Align Your Confession With Redemption

Your words must agree with what Christ has finished. Confession is not denial of facts; it is agreement with truth.

“Let the weak say, I am strong.” — Joel 3:10 (KJV)

You do not confess weakness to become strong. You confess strength because strength belongs to you.

Receive by Faith, Not Feeling

Healing does not always come with sensation. Many people miss their healing because they wait to feel something.

“For we walk by faith, not by sight.” — 2 Corinthians 5:7 (KJV)

Faith receives before feelings change.

"If you wait to feel healed, you may never enforce healing." — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Maintain Your Healing

After receiving healing, you must guard your mind and confession. Doubt tries to reopen closed doors.

"Neither give place to the devil." — Ephesians 4:27 (KJV)

Maintaining healing requires consistency in truth.

Healing is not sustained by excitement. It is sustained by light.

Chapter 9: The Power of the Communion

The communion is not a religious ritual. It is a spiritual transaction rooted in covenant. When rightly understood and engaged, the communion enforces healing and sustains divine health.

Apostle Michael Orokpo teaches that the communion is one of the strongest platforms for enforcing the finished work of Christ in the believer's body.

The Bread Represents the Body of Christ

The bread of the communion represents the physical body of Jesus that was broken for us.

“And he took bread, and gave thanks, and brake it, and gave unto them, saying, This is my body which is given for you: this do in remembrance of me.” — Luke 22:19 (KJV)

Jesus did not break His body symbolically. His body was physically broken so that our bodies could be made whole.

When you partake of the bread, you are declaring that His broken body has replaced your broken condition.

“The communion is where you exchange your weakness for Christ's wholeness.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

The Cup Represents the Blood of the Covenant

The cup represents the blood Jesus shed to establish a new covenant.

“Likewise also the cup after supper, saying, This cup is the new testament in my blood, which is shed for you.” — Luke 22:20 (KJV)

Blood speaks in the realm of the spirit. The blood of Jesus speaks better things than sickness, sin, or death.

“And to Jesus the mediator of the new covenant, and to the blood of sprinkling, that speaketh better things than that of Abel.” — Hebrews 12:24 (KJV)

The blood establishes legality. It silences every accusation and every claim sickness tries to make.

Communion as a Healing Platform

The early church understood the power of the communion.

> “And they continued stedfastly in the apostles’ doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of bread, and in prayers.” — Acts 2:42 (KJV)

Breaking of bread was not casual. It was intentional and powerful.

When believers partake with understanding, healing flows naturally.

Discern the Lord’s Body

Paul warned the church about taking the communion without understanding.

“For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord’s body.” — 1 Corinthians 11:29 (KJV)

Not discerning the Lord’s body brings weakness. Discerning it brings strength and healing.

“For this cause many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep.” — 1 Corinthians 11:30 (KJV)

This shows clearly that the communion affects the physical body.

Enforcing Healing Through Communion

When you partake of the communion, you are not hoping something will happen. You are enforcing what Christ has already done.

You consciously declare that:

- His body was broken for your health
- His blood secured your covenant
- Sickness has no legal right

“Every time you take the communion with understanding, you announce judgment on sickness.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Communion and Divine Health

The communion is not only for healing; it is for sustaining divine health.

When taken consistently with understanding, it strengthens your consciousness of redemption and keeps your body aligned with divine life.

The communion keeps the finished work active in your body.

Chapter 10: From Healing to Divine Health

Healing is good, but divine health is better. Healing restores what was lost. Divine health prevents loss from happening again.

Apostle Michael Orokpo teaches that God's ultimate desire is not for believers to keep recovering from sickness, but to live above it. Divine health is the consistent state of the redeemed life.

Healing Deals With Crisis, Divine Health Deals With Life

Healing often comes when something is wrong. Divine health functions before anything goes wrong.

"Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth." — 3 John 1:2 (KJV)

Divine health flows from alignment. When the soul prospers in truth, the body follows.

"Healing corrects damage; divine health maintains dominion." — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Divine Health Is Sustained by God's Life

Divine health is not sustained by human strength. It is sustained by the life of God.

"If the Spirit of him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwell in you, he that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal bodies by his Spirit that dwelleth in you." — Romans 8:11 (KJV)

The same Spirit that raised Jesus now lives in the believer. That Spirit supplies life continually.

Sickness cannot dominate where divine life is active.

Consciousness Determines Experience

What you are conscious of will eventually show in your body. A sickness-conscious believer will keep reacting to symptoms. A righteousness-conscious believer will walk in stability.

“For as he thinketh in his heart, so is he.” — Proverbs 23:7 (KJV)

Divine health requires a shift in consciousness.

“You don’t live by what you feel; you live by what you know.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

Feeding on the Word Sustains Health

Divine health is maintained by consistent intake of God’s Word.

“My son, attend to my words; incline thine ear unto my sayings... For they are life unto those that find them, and health to all their flesh.” — Proverbs 4:20–22 (KJV)

God’s Word supplies life and health. Neglecting the Word weakens spiritual immunity.

Walking in Divine Health Daily

Divine health is expressed daily through:

- Word consciousness
- Proper confession
- Consistent communion
- Spiritual alertness

These are not rituals. They are lifestyles.

The Mystery of Christ in You

The Gospel does not end with Christ for you. It reaches its fullness with Christ in you.

“To whom God would make known what is the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; which is Christ in you, the hope of glory.” — Colossians 1:27 (KJV)

Christ in you means God's life now lives inside you. This life is superior to sickness, decay, and death.

“Christianity is not God visiting you; it is God living in you.” — Apostle Michael Orokpo

The Life of Christ Dominates Sickness

Where Christ lives, His life dominates. Sickness cannot coexist with divine life when that life is allowed to rule.

“That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith.” — Ephesians 3:17 (KJV)

God desires to reveal His life through His people.

"As my Father hath sent me, even so send I you." — John 20:21 (KJV)

Believers are God's channels on the earth.

Healing flows naturally when divine life is hosted consistently.
